

Beyond Black Mountain was founded in 2021 as an NPC to highlight and restore our conservation and tourism sectors in Caledon and the greater Theewaterskloof.

One of our primary focuses are the conservation, protection and rebuilding of the Caledon Wildflower Garden and Nature Reserve for future generations.

This absolutely unique site is on the brink of collapse and requires urgent intervention.

Restoration of this site will serve as a bastion and a rally point around which we aim to further develop the conservation and tourism footprint within the area and the greater region to the benefit of all.

PROJECT BACKGROUND

This impressive natural heritage together with its culturally important Khoi kraal and Natural monument (The Venster Rock formation) have come under severe pressure due to lack of resources over many years thereby causing species that have developed over millennia in a unique environment like no other in the world to come to the brink of extinction . . . it may already be too late for some species of flora. Some species have developed quite uniquely in areas so that they are so rare that they only occur within a small geographical area and nowhere else on Earth. The Caledon Wildflower and Nature Reserve which was created as a haven for these unique species is currently about 80% overrun with alien vegetation, crowding out local species and threatening water security to the area.

The once Crown-Jewel of Caledon – the now 98-year-old Wildflower Garden and Nature Reserve is situated in a 214Ha site, which was demarcated as a reserve by Queen Victoria in 1899 and placed under the stewardship of the then Caledon Municipality. In 1964 it became one of the first Nature Reserves to be proclaimed by the Department of Nature Conservation to protect the endangered fynbos and heather species only found on the slopes of the Klein Swartberg. In the Wildflower Garden itself there are water features, lawns, picnic sites and walkways throughout 56Ha of trees and plants under cultivation against a backdrop of the nature reserve's and privately managed Klein Swartberg conservancy's mountainside. Some say that it is more impressive than Kirstenbosch, because it demonstrates the ability of plants to survive in adverse conditions.

Into this background, Beyond Black Mountain NPC aims to partner with other likeminded organisations to bring this area back from the brink and reinvigorate this unique biosphere to preserve it for future generations and thereby also kickstart other initiatives that can tie into this vision.

During November 2021, the Theewaterskloof municipality signed into action a Memorandum of Agreement that would allow Beyond Black Mountain NPC to start work in the Caledon Wildflower Garden and Nature Reserve in conjunction with the municipality to look at various conservation projects to revitalise the gardens and the nature reserve... all the while, time is running out for the many potentially critically endangered species.

We want to create a network with the Caledon Wildflower Garden and Nature Reserve as the centre of a web spanning various conservation, eco-tourism, learnership, tourism, local-economic development and other programs to present a holistic picture of what is possible when people unite with conservation at its centre.



Vision

To develop the Caledon Wildflower Garden, Nature Reserve, Tourism, Information Centre and Businesses to benefit the community at large.



Future Projects

WHAT IS ALIEN VEGETATION CLEARING/ HACKING?

We invite community-based volunteers to assist in the removal and/or management of Alien vegetation of which predominantly Black Wattle, Port Jackson, Pine and Blue Gum make up the bulk.

Our hacks run every last Saturday of the month and we give our volunteers training of the identification of Alien vegetation and how to effectively remove and/or manage it.

We make use of a variety of tools, including Tree Poppers, saws, axes and plain old elbow grease.

We will in future have chainsaw training and tackle the mature alien trees as well.

WHAT IS OUR NEED?

We currently need funding to purchase or donation of the following items:

- Tree Poppers: Mini - R1740.00 each Small - R2600.00 each
- Handsaws: R400+
- Hand Axes / Hatchets: R150+
- Bowsaws: R400+
- First aid kit: R400+

WISHLIST ITEMS

- Chainsaws (heavy duty): R8500+
- Woodchipper (Industrial size): R400 000+
- John Deere Gator: Second hand R168 000 New R400 000+

WHO ARE THE ECO RANGERS?

The Eco Rangers are a group of primary and high school aged learners with a love of nature and who would like to learn more about it. They will be facilitated on a weekly basis with nature and environmental based activities, workshops, talks and events.

REFURBISHMENT OF INFORMATION OFFICE AND ABULTION BLOCK


This project is busy being costed and we will revert back with a budget on request.
